I would like to thank Kaili for her work this past season. She was a great resource for me being new to the U11 role as well as running her U13 program very smoothly and without any issues. This is a testament to her professionalism, the trust she's gained and relationships she's built over the years, and her ability to execute. Thanks for all your hard work.

General Notes:

Our primary concern with the start of the season for U11 was our goalie situation. We only had 2 dedicated goalies for 5 teams. As the season progressed some teams were able to balance the goalie shortfall with active players who would trade out the responsibility. Other teams had players step into the world of full-time goalie. Both did a fantastic job in covering the position and I hope to see some of the players choose goaltending as their future full-time position in hockey. Another note with the goaltending was the mid-season change of goaltending skill coaches. Families and players all were very receptive to the change and found it to have a positive impact on the goaltending skills program.

U13 did not have any issues with full time goaltending but looking ahead for the 2023/24 season we may be challenged with finding enough full-time goaltenders.

Boots Player Skills continued this season. Overall, players enjoyed the ice time but found that the two teams on split ice with the goaltending clinic limited what they could work on due to the limited amount of space on the ice. Boots always does a great job getting to know the players and coaches and keeping the ice times structured and productive. Thanks for all your support, Boots.

Another concern was the number of full-ice practices for one team. For U11, a team saw full ice practice once every 5 weeks.

One idea that came up was to provide support for the new volunteers coming up from initiation. They have little exposure to HiSport, PCAHA rules and using the time clock. A meeting with all new volunteers would be helpful prior to the start of the season to have all volunteers aligned.

To all the friends, families, coaches, players, and volunteers... on more THANK YOU for supporting this past season and community sports! Looking forward to seeing you all next year at the rink.

As one of the smallest female programs in the PCAHA region, 60% of our eligible teams made it to divisional championships and we're incredibly proud of their skill, performance, and sportsmanship throughout the season.

SDMHA has been incredibly supportive of the Stars program and we would not have the success and growth we have seen without the support of our community. On behalf of the Stars community, we would like to thank SDMHA for their continued dedication to our female hockey players who chose to play with the Delta Stars.

Our success would also not be possible without the hundreds of hours that our volunteers put into the program. To all the coaches, managers, safety people, and other volunteers - THANK YOU! Our program would not exist without you.

The Delta Stars fielded 6 teams during the season, growing by 2 teams over the size of the Stars program last year. South Delta declared teams in each of U9, U13, U15, and U18 and two in the U11 age groups. We were able to accommodate every girl that wanted to play female hockey. As always with female hockey, registration numbers and the ages of players posed challenges to being able to make functionally sized rosters. Brittany Kirby was involved in evaluating the players in U9 and U11 to ensure girls were playing at an appropriate skill level.

<u>U9</u> had a total of 12 players. The team was Coached by Ryan DeWolff with Assistant Coaching from U18 player, Alexis Kamiya. Team Manager was Andrea DeWolff.

<u>U11</u> had a total of 26 players. The group was divided into skill based teams in September: C1, 12 players; C2,14 players.

Robbie Morrison was the C1 Head Coach with Ryan Fraser and Lance Jefferson as Assistant Coaches. Susan McGregor was the manager of C1. Regan Elmer head coached the C2 team with Steve Bentley and Nick Williams as her Assistant Coaches. Rachel Mueller was the manager. All U11 girls practiced together however they were placed in different tiers for the season.

U11 teams played in multiple tournaments throughout the season, taking home silver medals at Wickfest and the Nanaimo female tournament.

<u>U13</u> had a total of 11 players. Mark Crocker was the Head Coach with Assistant Coaching provided by Lance Jefferson and Ryan Fraser. The team was managed by Esme Kanda.

<u>U15</u> had a total of 16 players. Travis O'Donnell was the Head Coach with Assistant Coaching provided by God Wright, Rich Kellington and Iain Lancaster. The team was managed by Anne Ashe. U15 showed up well at their tournaments, taking home the silver at the Nanaimo tournament.

The <u>U18</u> team was made up of 13 players. The team was coached by Dave Clutterham, with assistant coaches Jeff Kay and Mike Ikari. The Team was managed by Stacey Kamiya. The U18 left the Nanaimo tournament with gold medals around their necks. Additionally, many of the girls played in the PCAHA scholarship tournament. Congrats to Alexis Kamiya for her scholarship win!

Highlights:

- All Stars teams kicked off their season at Tilbury on the same day this year and we were able to welcome the girls back to the season with a Star-studded celebration. The event allowed the girls to feel connected and allowed them to see the program is bigger than their single team.
- Growth the program. 67 players in 4 teams in 21/22 to 78 players in 6 teams in 22/23 season.
- We were able to affiliate players to support our low team numbers. PCAHA granted permission for Dayley Fraser to have a permanent goalie affiliation spot on the U11C1 team. We are grateful for Dayley's commitment to play in almost all U13 and U11C1 games.
- Three teams made it to their divisional championships. The U15 and U18 fought hard and had
 incredible championship matches and the U11C1 team was victorious in their championship
 run. U11C1 battled Ridge Meadows on home ice to secure the win and we look forward to
 hoisting the banner at Tilbury.
- Two "Skate with the Stars" events were scheduled since the last AGM. One had to be cancelled however the second one, hosted on May 6, saw 25 girls come out and try hockey. We're grateful to Regan Elmer and the U11/U18 girls who got up early on a Saturday to help out with this amazing event.
- Regan Elmer also hosted "Learn to Play" program for girls who want to learn more of the fundamentals of hockey before starting the regular season. We limited the group to 12 skaters to allow for more personalized learning.
- Our U11, U13, and U15 teams were supported with regular skills training from our Skills & Player Development Coordinator, Brittany Kirby. Brittany's participation in the program is valued by both players and coaches. Attendance by the U11 group was excellent however the U13 and U15 found the time and location (Planet Ice Delta) to be challenging.
- Sponsorship funds in the amount of \$2000.00 was secured from Scotiabank (\$1000 from
 Tsawwassen Branch and \$1000 from Ladner Branch). Delta Stars really appreciate the ongoing
 yearly support from Scotiabank and have allocated this funding for future promotion of the
 Stars program in our community.

Upcoming projects and challenges for the Delta Stars in the 2023/2024 Season:

 Continued recruitment & retention of new female players (focus on recruitment of younger age groups to feed older age groups)

- Possible Stars cohort in U6 and U7 for girls who are interested in playing with other girls at a younger age.
- Recruitment, development and retention of female goalies. With PCAHA support, we are able
 to affiliate skaters from older divisions to play goal for younger divisions to support our
 numbers and provide more experiences for our girls who are interested in goaltending but are
 not ready to fully commit.
- More skill development for girls who want more than one practice a week. We are hoping to offer more pay-for-service skill development sessions.
- Host a small female tournament at the end of the season.
- With SD girls needing to leave the association to play rep, our numbers are changing until the middle of September. This is challenging when declaring teams. Division registration is limited this season to control team sizes while continuing to support girls to play in their age group.
- Early communication to both parents and players about possible player evaluations, movement, and skill development is imperative.
- Continuing to support SDMHA in their efforts to find more ice to support growth. The growth of the Delta Stars is significantly limited by our limited ice time.
- Strengthening and bolstering the number of Delta Stars players through recruitment and retention efforts in order to field a rep team in the future years. Some Delta Stars players have been leaving over the years to play female rep hockey in Richmond and Surrey.

SDMHA REFEREE-IN-CHIEF AGM REPORT 2022-2023

The 2022/23 hockey season was a very successful one for our South Delta officials. It was great to have a full regular season, playoffs, provincial championships in addition to three tournaments.

At the beginning of the season, we started with over 50 carded officials. We conducted one new official clinic in conjunction with North Delta. South Delta added 25 new officials.

Supervisions and mentoring was provided through on-ice shadowing and in-person conversations at the U11, U13 & U15 recreational and competitive levels. In total there were over 50 supervisions and mentorships that happened in the 2022/23 season. The addition of a couple young officials as mentors in the 2023/24 season will further aid in the development of young officials.

The three tournaments were the Tim Jardine, U13 A and the Ken Elmer (formerly the Party in Da House tournament). The Tim Jardine tournament saw a combination of local officials and hand-selected officials from across the lower mainland. There were no officiating concerns and the overall feedback from coaches and the tournament organizers was that the officiating crews did a very good job. The U13A tournament was an opportunity for local experienced officials to be on the ice with younger officials to further their development. Some of the younger officials from South and North Delta were given opportunities to step up and officiated some very strong games. The Ken Elmer had a few challenges due to the timing of the games and official availability, especially at the older age groups. The younger officials within the system did a great job and tournaments like this provide a great opportunity for learning and growth.

Hosting the U18A Tier 2 provincial championship saw three local officials selected for the on-ice crew. This included one of those selected to officiate a semi-final game and the whole crew represented SDMHA with professionalism.

Going into the 2023/24 hockey season I do believe there is an increased value at the U11 C level that these games are officiated as a two-official system in the first half of the season. This will allow for increased opportunities for young officials to make calls and be engaged in all parts of the game.

I would also like to thank all the coaching staff from all South Delta teams for their continued support of all of our officials. Across the hundreds of games skated within South Delta we had very few issues from South Delta coaches when it came to conduct.

I am excited to continue as the South Delta Minor Hockey Referee-in-Chief for the years to come.

SDMHA RISK MANAGER REPORT 2022-2023

We opened the 2022- 2023 Season with a series of Player/ Parent Risk Management meetings. The purpose of which was to share the renewed commitment of Hockey Canada and SDMHA to lead, develop and promote a positive hockey experience for all involved and that there is ZERO tolerance for any behaviours that constitute harassment or abuse. During the meetings the SDMHA behaviour expectations were shared, the new SDMHA Code of Conducts were signed, and the Disciplinary/ Conflict Resolution Process reviewed. These meetings were in general well received, and I have been stopped and complimented on the messaging and professionalism of these meetings many times.

Also, this season, I, in association with the SDMHA Executive, reviewed and updated the following policies: Discipline/ Conflict Resolution Process, 24 Hour Policy, Locker Room Policy, Electronic Device Policy and Communication and Social Media Policy.

We received a total of 23 reported risk management incidents for the 2022- 2023 Season and following our Disciplinary/ Conflict Resolution Process 22 were resolved with phone and email communications and only 1 required the convening of a Disciplinary Hearing.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the SDMHA Executive and all the Coaches, Team Officials and Game Officials for all their time and efforts both on and off the ice this season without passionate and committed volunteers to lead SDMHA, it would not be the strong, vibrant and healthy community it is. Please enjoy the summer and well-earned break before returning for the 2023 - 2024 season of hockey.
